My primary area of interest is the examination of structural models of normal and pathological personality in relation to psychopathology. Specifically, much of my research has focused on the conceptualization and assessment of personality disorders and externalizing behavior (e.g., substance abuse, aggression, etc.) using various personality models (e.g., Five Factor Model, DAPP, SNAP, etc.) as well as various methods of personality assessment (e.g., clinician-ratings, self-report, etc.).

- **Current Projects**

- *Dissertation:* Validation of the DSM-5 Trait Dimensional Diagnostic System for Personality Disorder
 - This project examines the reliability and validity of a clinician-rating form and self-report measure of the proposed DSM-5 pathological personality trait model in an outpatient clinical sample. Clinician and self-reported DSM-5 traits will be examined in relation to existing models of personality, psychological symptoms, externalizing behavior, and treatment utilization and satisfaction.
- Self-report assessment of DSM-5 pathological personality traits: Relations with existing models of normal and pathological personality
 - Using a college sample, this project examines a 220-item self-report measure and a single-item self-report rating form of the 25 proposed DSM-5 pathological traits in relation to the Five-Factor Model and Dimensional Assessment of Personality Pathology
 - Involved in study design and rating form development, data collection and analysis, preparation of primary manuscript as first author
- Investigating the construct validity of the Elemental Psychopathy Assessment (EPA)
 - This study intends to expand the nomological network of the EPA, a newly developed psychopathy measure designed to assess 18 Five-Factor Model traits relevant to psychopathy. The EPA is examined in relation to existing measures of psychopathy, FFM domains, and externalizing behaviors.
 - Involved in data analysis and preparation of primary manuscript
- Examining clinicians' responses to mental health disorders using fMRI
 - This project examines brain activation of clinicians' when exposed to patient vignettes depicting various mental health disorders. The study aims to determine whether clinicians respond differentially to disorders as well as potential moderators of differential responding.
